#### 1) Self-Reporting begins for current Grade 12 students

As of October 1, current Grade 12 secondary school students in all provinces may self-report their final Grade 11 marks to UVic and potentially receive a conditional offer of admission for September 2008 as early as this fall.

To promote this initiative, UVic is sending your school two informational posters, which will arrive in early October. Please assist UVic by displaying these posters in a suitable place.

Eligible students must apply for admission to UVic online at <http://registrar.uvic.ca>, then visit [www.uvic.ca/self-reporting](http://www.uvic.ca/self-reporting) to self-report their final Grade 11 marks. Marks must be submitted to UVic by November 30, 2007. Students whose final Grade 11 marks average between 85% and 89% (90% for writing students) will be offered conditional admission. Any student whose average is 90% or better will also be rewarded with a guaranteed scholarship of \$1,000.

Please remind students who are interested in on-campus housing and entrance scholarships that they must submit separate applications upon applying for admission to UVic.
